A Message from Your Community Foundation

The Mt. Pleasant Area Community Foundation's Board of Trustees, staff and many volunteers are excited to present The Legacy, an annual magazine highlighting accomplishments from the last year in building endowments, grantmaking, and community leadership. This publication celebrates our growth as an organization dedicated to the stewardship of resources entrusted to us by donors in our community. Because of the support of 60 generous sponsors (featured on the back



cover), we are able to share stories of local philanthropy and community impact in publications like this that reach thousands throughout Isabella County and beyond. The Legacy includes great photos and stories about those who have started permanent endowment funds within the Community

Foundation, and the organizations and individuals who have benefitted from grant awards. MPACF now holds 290 funds. There were 1,615 individual gifts made to these funds in 2018—in amounts ranging from five dollars to thousands of dollars—further building community capital to meet the needs of future generations. The Community Foundation is

not tied to a single social cause or mission. Instead, we are responsible for making the right investments, in the right organizations, at the right times. We have committed volunteers with broad expertise who serve our donors and our nonprofit partners by matching available

resources to projects and programs addressing current community needs. In 2018, these volunteers helped to award 214 grants. Earlier this year, 103 scholarships were awarded. Since our inception in 1990, the Community Foundation has awarded more than \$7 million in grants to schools, local governments and charities. That's more than \$7 million granted while maintaining the value of every endowed gift ever given to the Foundation! We continued our focus on community leadership in 2018, successfully helping to raise more than \$1 million to launch the William and Janet Strickler Nonprofit Center at 1114 West High Street in Mt. Pleasant. Several partner agencies have worked hard to develop this shared facility for charities working to address the most pressing needs of Isabella County citizens living in or near poverty. Tenant agencies of the Strickler Center provide food, clothing, personal care items, and substance abuse counseling/recovery support/prevention services. In this year's Legacy Magazine, we highlight the efforts of a special initiative fund serving citizens of Shepherd. With twenty years of fundraising and grantmaking, those associated with the Shepherd Community Fund have much to celebrate. We hope their story and others inspire you to invest in people and place through the Mt. Pleasant Area Community Foundation. Together, we will continue to enhance the quality of life for all citizens of Isabella County, now and for generations to come.

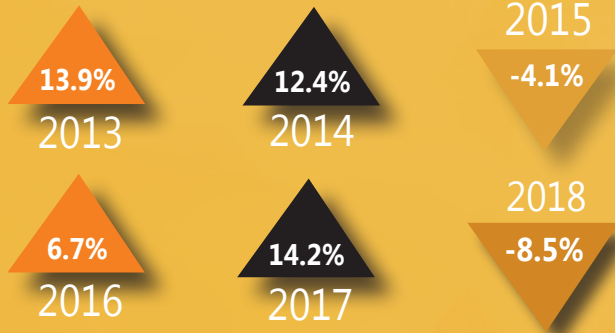

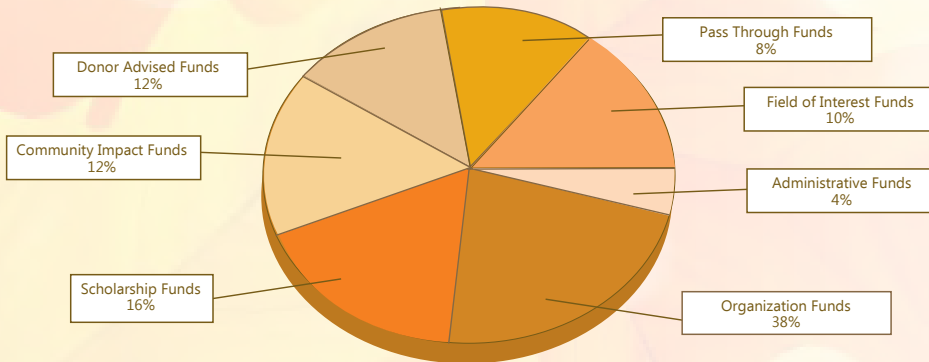

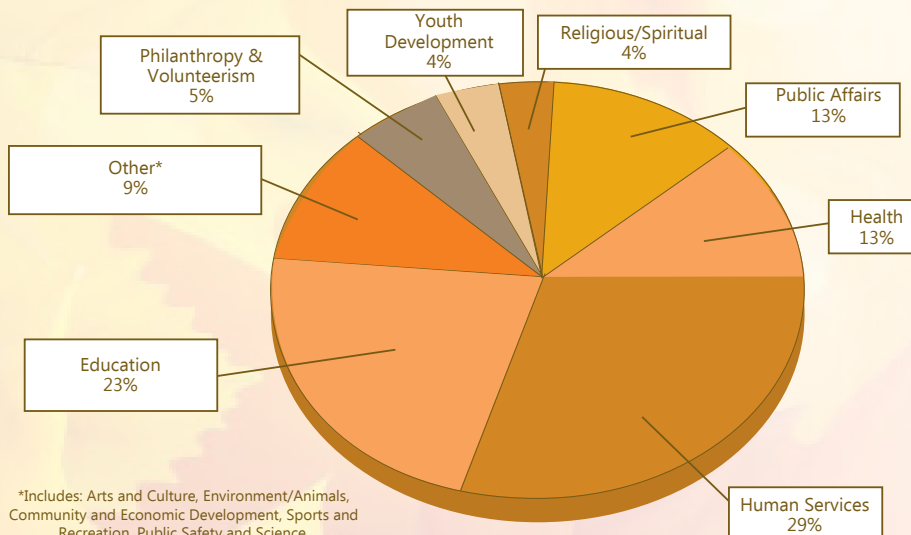
ASSETS BY FUND TYPE

Shepherd Community Fund: Building the Foundation for a better Shepherd



The Shepherd Community Fund in Honor of Robert H. Bates awards grants to organizations that work toward improving the community of Shepherd and the welfare of its residents.

The Fund was founded in 1998 and is named in honor of Robert H. Bates, an active and beloved resident of Shepherd who passed away in 2008 at age 99.

Douglas Dodge, who initiated the Fund, met Bates when he moved to Shepherd in 1993. Dodge worked as a superintendent for Shepherd Public Schools where Bates worked as the high school's principal.

Dodge said they decided to name the Fund in honor of Bates because he exemplified what they were striving to do.

"He was real involved in his church and did more things than people even knew just because he thought that's what people should do," Dodge said. "He was a wonderful, wonderful man and I had the pleasure of knowing him."

As of June 2019, 58 grants have been given from the Shepherd Community Fund, totaling over \$60,000 in awards.

The Fund has awarded several grants over the years to the Village, Shepherd Public Schools, and the Police Department. They also help with the Shepherd After Prom Party each year and projects such as Wishing for a Washer, the Shepherd Santa House, and the restoration project for the Little Red School House Museum.

The fund is endowed so grants are awarded solely from the interest earned on the invested capital. Grants are made in three cycles each year as part of a competitive process facilitated by Mt. Pleasant Area Community Foundation staff and volunteers. The Shepherd Community Fund is considered a field-

of-interest fund because all grants made from it benefit the Shepherd community.

"All we had was a vision," Dodge said. "We had a small amount of money and it's grown over the years to what it is."

According to Joyce Gluch, the current president of the Shepherd Community Fund Advisory Board, today the capital amounts to nearly \$200,000.

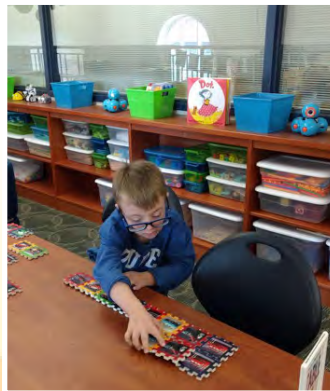
"You have to have community support otherwise it doesn't go anywhere," Dodge said. "Most people don't have a lot of disposable dollars and they're spending that on something they think is well worth it."

The Shepherd Community Fund has two fundraisers each year: the Spring Dinner and the Reverse Raffle every fall. To donate an item for the raffle, contact Gina Gross at the Village of Shepherd or call (989) 828-5278.

Jason Parrot Fund

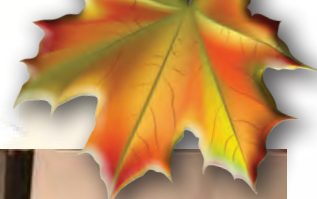

Isabella Child Development Center

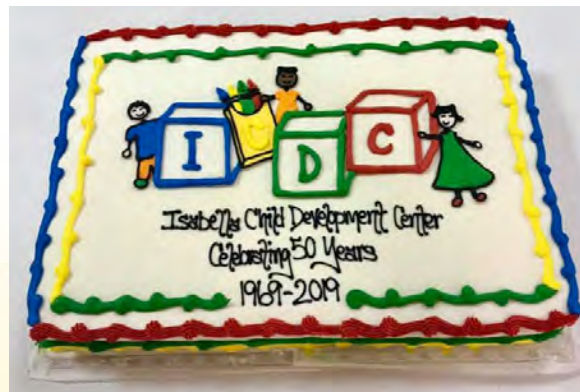


For the past fifty years, the Isabella Child Development Center has been providing free preschool services for eligible three and four year old children. Since opening its doors in 1969, the school has served over 1,200 students. Their goal is to help their students become independent, self-confident, curious learners who can work well with others. They accomplish this with "high scope curriculum" that builds off the children's interests to teach them math, reading, and cognitive skills, among others. According to the Michigan Department of Education, the ICDC is succeeding tremendously. After their most recent assessment, the Isabella Child Development Center was named a five star preschool.



The ICDC holds their first class in 1969.

The vast majority of brain development occurs in a child's first five years, which is why preschool is critical for life-long success. It helps children master school-based skills such as literacy and math, as well as improves social and emotional development. Preschool is especially beneficial for low income households where opportunities for development and socialization may be limited. Preschool has even been found to reduce high school drop-out and incarceration rates among low income learners.



Along with the ICDC's founding, a volunteer-run thrift shop was created in order to cover the school's expenses. For decades the thrift shop was the ICDC's only source of funding, and it still continues to operate to this day. Now, the Isabella Child Development Center Fund will provide additional financial support for years to come.



John D. and Judy M. Williams Scholarship Fund

The John D. and Judy M. Williams Scholarship Fund was established with the intent of encouraging Shepherd students to pursue a future in education. Both John and Judy have spent their lives in Shepherd.



Married on July 27th, 1963, they have two children, Patrick and Pamela, six grandchildren and one great grandchild. John is the fifth generation of the Williams family to live in Shepherd since 1865. He taught in the Shepherd School District for 14 years. He has held many community positions: charter member of the Shepherd Jaycees, Shepherd Lions Club and the St. Vincent de Paul K of C. He then branched out and returned to the family insurance and real estate business while Judy focused on teaching. Following in her mother's footsteps, Judy taught 30 years, both in Shepherd and Winn. While beginning with English, Judy's real joy was in elementary education and music for k-6 students. Both John and Judy are proud that their legacy is continuing through their granddaughter who is now a high school teacher in Shepherd. Through this scholarship fund, they hope to encourage Shepherd students to pursue education as a career in their future.

Community Compassion Network Fund



Community Compassion Network is a Christian organization made up of volunteers from a wide variety of churches, businesses, organizations, and student groups. CCN strives to fight hunger by providing supplemental food to over 18,000 Isabella County families in need with dignity and equity. In Isabella County, 16.6% of the population suffers from food insecurity. However, thanks to the Community Compassion Network, residents can utilize the resource to obtain necessary food items for themselves and their children.

The Community Compassion Network Fund was established in 2018, and will help to sustain the Nutrition Club for elementary school children as well as the William Brockman Infant Pantry. CCN will be able to continue programs like Nutrition Club which delivers over 600 bags of nutritious food twice a month to young students. Additionally, CCN provides supplemental diapers and other child care necessities to 195 infants and toddlers every month.

The Fund was established with a donation by the Larry Collins family, and family and friends of Mike Lindsay, with hopes that it will help Community Compassion Network grow their impact.



Dr. Joyce Ann Carter Fund

For Dr. Joyce Ann Carter, higher education and student success were the backbone of her life and career. Both she and her husband, Gerry, obtained Ph.D. degrees and were long-time faculty at Central Michigan University where she held the Director of Academic Assistance position. By working in academic assistance, Dr. Carter developed a passion for aiding struggling students in non-traditional situations. After spending many years guiding students to financial stability, Dr. Carter realized the need for more resources for these students.

The Dr. Joyce Ann Carter Memorial Scholarship Fund was established to address the need for financial support for non-traditional students who are attempting to follow their dream of attending college. Many of these students are single parents who work low wage jobs and have very limited financial resources at their disposal. Unlike new high school graduates, non-traditional students have few scholarship opportunities to support the costs of a college education. The scholarship offers financial assistance to students' ages 25-45 years that were interrupted due to financial or personal struggle. The scholarship fund is a legacy held at MPACF in hopes that it will continue to grow and provide opportunities to these students.



Watson Family Scholarship

After 29 years as a secretary in Isabella County schools, Elayne Watson believes strongly in the importance of education. She watched hundreds of local students grow up from kindergarteners to sixth graders while she served at Mary McGuire Elementary School and describes them all as unforgettable. The profound impact these children had on Elayne, along with the love of her family and her commitment to giving back to the community, is what inspired her to create the Watson Family Scholarship. Elayne hopes to encourage local students to continue with their education after high school and wants to leave a positive impact on future generations.



In addition to supporting her community, this scholarship fund is also an opportunity for Elayne to honor her large and loving family. She has five children, fourteen grandchildren, and seventeen great-grandchildren!

Students applying for this scholarship must be planning a career in education, medicine, or a skilled trade. Elayne decided on these career paths because they are the professions of her children. Her two sons, Jay and Guy, work as tradesmen; Doris is a nurse practitioner; Jan is a teacher and Rita also works in a public school. This scholarship will honor the Watson family's contributions to Isabella County for years to come.

Elayne has served her community in a variety of ways, from volunteering at the Isabella Community Soup Kitchen, helping at McLaren Central Michigan, and making time to visit those in assisted living. She has dedicated her life to education, family, community, and volunteering. Elayne continuously uses her generosity to make Isabella County a better place.

Arnold and Margret Sowmick Fund



Arnold and Margret Sowmick dedicated their lives to civic service and the improvement of their community, creating an enduring impact that can still be seen today. Arnold was a decorated Korean War veteran who served in the U.S. Air Force. He served on the Saginaw Chippewa Tribal Council for thirty years, eight of which he spent as chief. While chief, unemployment rates dropped from 65% to 20% and programs were developed in support of education, housing, care for the elderly, preventing substance abuse, and developing the economy.

Margret worked in education as a teacher's aide and was invaluable to the Johnson O'Malley Educational Program for American Indian Children. She was an incredibly supportive partner who helped Arnold achieve his goals for the Tribe. They were both members of the Michigan Inter-Tribal Council, The Great Lakes Inter-Tribal Council, The Council of Energy Resource Tribes, and Michigan Indian Legal Services.

Joseph Sowmick, one of their five children, remembers them as civic leaders. "Mom and Dad talked a lot about stewardship and the importance of working for the community," he states. "I've seen a lot of accomplishments they achieved over 10 years ago still coming in today."

The Arnold and Margret Sowmick Memorial Scholarship Fund was established to benefit the education and development of Native American youth and other youth of the community who are emulating the leadership skills of Arnold and Margret.

J. Gavin Bradley Culinary/Hospitality Memorial Scholarship Fund

J. Gavin Bradley began a love affair with food and cooking as a child. His passion for the craft made him a perfectionist when it came to cooking. The smells, flavors, and feeling you receive after having a delicious meal left him with a sense of purpose. At just 19 years old, Gavin traveled to Paris where he began his culinary education. Subsequently, he obtained the Grand Diploma at Le Cordon Bleu in Sydney Australia. After becoming an expert in culinary technique, he founded a food blog to share the exquisite meals he prepared for friends and family. During culinary school, Gavin met his wife Soo and they married shortly after graduating. Soo was from Korea and often traveled with Gavin. She now works as Head Pastry Chef at Soaring Eagle Casino & Resort.



Gavin was often described as “absolutely fearless” and it showed in his everyday life. His love of adventure led him to receive scuba certification as a master diver. He had extensive adventures motorcycling across Australia. His passion for cooking and love of adventure collided when he traveled to Costa Rica for a year to develop his skills in cooking and preparing seafood. Not only was Gavin adventurous with travel, he was also adventurous with his cooking.

Following many years of transcontinental traveling, Gavin moved back to the U.S. where he lived in Seattle and Bellingham, Washington. Surrounded by the breathtaking lakes, rivers, and forests of Washington, Gavin was able to continue to fine-tune his fishing, hunting, and cooking skills. To grow his skills in all fields of culinary technique, he worked as a chocolatier. Eventually, he became a master at the craft and won an award for making a Louis Vuitton bag out of chocolate. Most recently, Gavin’s love to travel brought him on new adventures to Cambodia, Thailand, and Korea, widening his knowledge of Asian cuisine and appreciation for the local culture.

From a young age, it was clear that Gavin’s life would be filled with a consuming love of the pursuit of knowledge, travel, and adventure. Gavin’s family hopes that the J. Gavin Bradley Culinary/Hospitality Memorial Scholarship Fund will provide help to encourage others to pursue their goals.

Life Choices Parenting Program Fund



In 2006, Naomi and Jim Stark established what is now known as the Life Choices Parenting Program Fund. Life Choices of Central Michigan is a faith-based nonprofit that has been serving the local community since 1986. Today, the Life Choices Medical Clinic and Family Education Center are each regularly serving patients and clients through free of charge services that range from pregnancy testing, limited obstetrical ultrasound, STD testing and education, the EmpowerLife Programs for parents, and a Sexual Health and Relationship Education (SHARE) Program.

These EmpowerLife Programs are designed to equip and educate parents to manage the emotional as well as physical pressures that come with parenting. In these programs, parents can earn credits, in the form of Baby Bucks, for attending classes while learning valuable parenting lessons. Parents may use Baby Bucks to purchase baby and toddler items, diapers, and a plethora of other items from the Baby Boutique. Life Choices offers individual and group parenting classes, each with a slightly different focus and duration. Each year, the EmpowerLife Programs serve participants through nearly 500 total classes. Investing in our youth and families is critical to the health and welfare of our community and investing in the Life Choices of Central Michigan Parenting Program Fund is investing in the future of our community.



Isabella Continuum of Care Fund

The Isabella Continuum of Care is on a mission to end homelessness in our local community. This collaborative is comprised of many nonprofit, religious, and governmental organizations that, by working together, are able to better serve those experiencing homelessness and poverty, as well as create long-term solutions to address these issues. In 2001, they established the Continuum Homeless Grant Fund with help from the Michigan State Housing Development Authority, the Council of Michigan Foundations, and the City of Mt. Pleasant. The fund supports local efforts to provide affordable housing and assist with rent. It serves as a preventative measure toward homelessness in Isabella County and provides transitional housing for those getting back on their feet.



Christa Jerome from EightCAP said, "Some believe if you can't see the homeless in the community, they must not exist. I believe, you must not only open your eyes, but also your heart and mind to see them, because they are here - just hoping someone will realize they are important enough to be seen."

EightCAP alone assists over five hundred community members annually, both those who are homeless and those who are at risk of becoming homeless. The Continuum of Care allows for community agencies like EightCAP to come together to talk about the barriers in place for the people they serve. Because of this collaboration, the average rate of homelessness for a household went from 89 days (FY 17-18) to 52 days (FY 18-19) in Isabella County. This has a positive impact on the community as a whole, as well as household stability, school attendance, safety factors, situational trauma, and general health and well-being.

Homelessness is a complex issue with many contributing factors including poverty, domestic abuse, disability, lack of affordable housing, and lack of employment opportunities. This is exactly why the Continuum of Care is so important – the network of service organizations makes it easier for community members to receive services that match their unique needs.

Nancy Carey Memorial Scholarship

Nancy Carey served Isabella County as a teacher for over twenty years. She was passionate about Speech and English, challenging her students to achieve academic excellence and become effective communicators.

Her teaching extended well beyond the classroom as she was heavily involved in her school's debate and forensics extracurriculars. Nancy served as a debate coach for over two decades, a passion that sparked when she competed on Wayne State University's debate team as an undergraduate.



Nancy was inspired to become an educator by her mother, who served as a teacher and school administrator in the Detroit area her whole life. Nancy taught in Lakeview Public Schools, Mt. Pleasant High School, and Sacred Heart Academy, impacting hundreds of students in the process. In addition to teaching, Nancy gave back to the community through the League of Women Voters and local Community Cancer Support Groups.

The Nancy Carey Memorial Scholarship honors her legacy by recognizing her commitment to her students and helping graduating seniors pursue the academic subjects about which she was most passionate. This scholarship is awarded to a graduating senior from Mt. Pleasant High School with achievement in English, Speech, Debate, or Forensics.

The Denison Legacy Society



The Denison Legacy Society was established in honor of Rollie and Olga Denison, who gave so bountifully of their time and resources to our community. 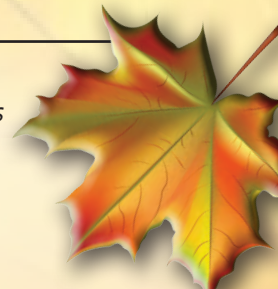

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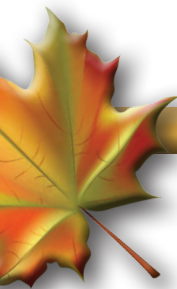
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
